Lincoln Elementary staff is committed to the goal of providing quality education for every child in our school. Everyone gains if parents are partners with teachers and other staff in the education of their children.

Lincoln Elementary staff believes that improving student academic achievement requires parents have an understanding of curriculum, academic achievement standards, assessments, district/school policies and procedures, and how to monitor their children's progress and work with educators, and is committed to doing what it takes.

Lincoln staff jointly developed/revised with parents the school Parent Participation Plan at an LPSG Board Meeting on November 2, 2021. This plan is also on the school website at www.vansd.org (Lincoln Elementary site).

COVID-19 has made organization of parent activities limited so far this school year.

Parents are provided an opportunity to meet with classroom teachers during the school district's scheduled conference days held on October 20, 21, and 22, 2021. Parents are also encouraged to meet with their children's teachers at any time during the school year. During the fall conference time, the Parent/School Compact was developed and signed.

All parents are notified of their child's assessment scores and eligibility for potential additional academic help during the school day, after school, or in summer programs. Parents are informed of student progress via the Goal Setting Conference in the fall and the Trimester Report Cards. Parents are encouraged to request information regarding their child's academic progress at any time from the school staff.

Lincoln Elementary students are instructed by teachers trained in the use of District approved curriculum. All students in grades K-5 are instructed using Eureka Math. Classroom instruction also includes the use of released SBA performance tasks. Students are assessed in a variety of ways including iReady, SBA, and Common Formative Assessments.

Lincoln staff participates in a variety of professional development opportunities throughout the school year. Staff will participate in both building and district level professional development focused on improving parent and school partnerships.

Lincoln staff has a philosophy that every teacher is a reading and math teacher. The Reading and Math Pathways guide the instruction for staff. All Federal, State and local resources that relate to reading and math instruction are coordinated to benefit student academic achievement.

Information related to Lincoln parent programs, meetings, and other activities are sent to parents in the school newsletter, through classroom news bulletins, and posted on the school website. Every attempt is made to clearly communicate information in the parents' native language.

Once we get beyond the current pandemic, parents will once again be invited and encouraged to get involved at Lincoln Elementary in the following ways:
